



Crochet Slip-Over

This simple slip over is made out of simple crocheted rectangles. It's so simple, even beginner crafters can make it!

Please use a soft yarn to make this a comfortable garment for the child.

Finished size: 58 cm/22" and approximately 42cm/16" or 13cm/5" longer than wide. The longer length will keep the child's tummy covered.

KAS would appreciate slip-overs that will fit 3-10 year old children.



Materials and Equipment

- Bulky wool yarn(American)/ chunky(UK)/ 12 ply(Aus)
- 6.00mm crochet /US J hook

Abbreviations

Note: Pattern uses American terminology

American	British
slip stitch (sl st)	single crochet (sc)
single crochet (sc)	double crochet (dc)
half double crochet (hdc)	half treble crochet (htc)
double crochet (dc)	treble (tr)

Instructions

Front and Back:

Start with a loosely crocheted chain of 43 stitches

Row 1: Hdc in 3rd chain from hook, and all the way across. (41 hdc)

First ch 2 counts as first hdc here and throughout.

Row 2: Ch 2 and turn. hdc IN BACK LOOP ONLY of each hdc of previous row. (41 hdc)

Repeat row 2 until the piece is the desired width, then turn and single crochet along all sides to give it a smooth finish.

Repeat these instructions to make a second piece.

Sew the two pieces together leaving, a space of 20cm/8" at the top for the neck opening, and 18cm/7" on sides for arms.

Finishing

Add a shelled decoration to the bottom. Attach yarn to any single crochet and sc in same space, skip 3 sc, *(dc ch dc ch dc ch dc) in next sc, skip 3 sc*. Repeat from * to * around bottom edge.

Variations

If you find your slip-over is too short, add a few rows of sc around the bottom before crocheting the edging.
