



## Mitre Square

This square is guaranteed to come out the right size, because it starts from the corner and grows outward.

### Materials and Equipment

- Worsted weight yarn (American)/ DK (UK)/ 8ply (Aust)
- 4.5mm/US 7 Hook

### Abbreviations

Note: Pattern uses American terminology

American	British
slip stitch (sl st)	single crochet (sc)
single crochet (sc)	double crochet (dc)

### Instructions

Chain(ch) 2.

**Row 1:** 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 1. 1 sc in first sc. 3 sc in next sc. 1 sc in last sc. Turn. (5 sts).

**Row 3:** Ch 1. 1 sc in each of first 2 sc. 3 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of last 2 sc. Turn. (7 sts).

**Row 4:** Ch 1. 1 sc in each of first 3 sc. 3 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of last 3 sc. Turn. (9 sts).

**Row 5:** Ch 1. 1 sc in each of first 4 sc. 3 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of last 4 sc. Turn. (11 sts).

**Next rows:** Ch 1 and add 2 sc in every row until square measures

20 cm/8" across.

Weave in all yarn ends.

Leave a 50 cm/20" tail (for sewing the squares together). Butterfly\* the tail to the square.

*\*How to 'butterfly the tail' is as easy as 1, 2, 3 . Use contrasting yarn and follow the directions:*



## Variations

Working in the back loop of the stitch creates a ridge and a different texture in the square, as shown here. This square also looks great in self-stripping or gradually changing coloured yarns.
