



Six Stitch Rib Square

As well as making squares which are thicker and warmer, ribbed squares have almost no curl around the edges, which makes them great, sturdy edge squares on a blanket as well as bright centre squares.

Materials and Equipment

- Light worsted yarn (US) / DK (UK) / 8 ply (Aust) using 2 strands together in any combination of colours.
- One pair 6mm needles (size 10 US, size 4 Old UK).
- A yarn sewing needle

Instructions

Cast on 30 stitches

Row 1: *knit3, purl3* repeat to end of row.

Row 2: *knit1, purl1* repeat to end of row.

Next rows: repeat rows 1 and 2 until work measures 20cm/8 inches

Cast off / bind off . Leave a 50 cm/20" tail (for sewing the squares together). Butterfly* the tail to the square.

**How to 'butterfly the tail' is as easy as 1, 2, 3 . Use contrasting yarn and follow the directions:*



Sew/darn in any other yarn ends along the edge of the square.

Variations

Use colourful yarn to add a bright square to a child's blanket.
